

parties have rushed to this Court. We could persuade both the erring groups to come to an amicable solution to resolve the impasse. We are glad to record our appreciation for the pragmatic approach taken by both the groups in resolving the issue once for all.

The parties agree, this order would not only put to an end to all litigations pending in different Courts but also the arbitration pending before the arbitral tribunal. The police have already started investigation and possibly have initiated criminal proceeding as against Suman, that would, however, be kept out of the purview of this order, as we are not competent to deal with the same.

The parties agree, Nilangshu would be reinstated with full honour as president of the association. The allegations made against Nilangshu are withdrawn. He would start acting as president of the association at once. The meetings held as 107<sup>th</sup> and 108<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting are set at naught. Nilangshu would convene the 107<sup>th</sup> and 108<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting in accordance with the rules of the association forthwith. He would be assisted by an interim committee of management headed by Nani Gopal Chandra and Arindam Kumar Saha, two members of the association. All three would act as a committee of management till the new committee is formed through 107<sup>th</sup> and 108<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting to be convened.

The Annual General Meeting so to be called, would be held under the active superintendence of a former Judge of this Court, Hon'ble Justice Sailendra Prasad Talukdar (as His Lordship then was) who is appointed Chairman of the meeting. Today onwards, the committee of management would seek advice of the Chairman not only for the purpose of convening of the Annual General Meeting but also in case of any difference of opinion between the members of the committee of management in running the day-to-day affairs and in such case the decision of the Chairman would hold the field.

We are told, the subsequent audit for two years being subsequent to 106<sup>th</sup> Annual General Meeting have already been conducted by the auditor of the association. In the Annual General Meeting, the agenda for passing of the accounts would be adjourned to enable the new committee to re-examine the accounts and if necessary, to rectify mistake, if any, crept in and then submit the modified and
